Cheerios Nuggets

- 1 cup packed brown sugar
- ½ cup margarine or butter softened
- ¼ cup lite corn syrup
- ½ teaspoon salt
- ½ teaspoon baking soda
- 6 cups Cheerios Cereal
- 1 cup salted Spanish peanuts
- 1 cup raisins

Heat oven to 250 degrees. Grease two rectangular pans 13 by 9 by 2-inches or 1 jelly roll pan, 15½ by 10½ by 1-inch. Heat brown sugar, margarine, corn syrup, and salt in 2 quart saucepan over medium heat, stirring constantly until bubbly around edges. Cook uncovered, stirring occasionally, 2 minutes longer. Remove from heat; stir in

soda until foamy and light colored. Pour over cereal, peanuts and raisins in greased 4 quart bowl. Stir until mixture is coarsed. Spread evenly in pan. Bake 15 minutes. Stir, let stand just until cool, about 10 minutes. Loosen mixture with metal spatula. Let stand until firm, about 30 minutes. Break into bite-size pieces. About 10 cup snack.

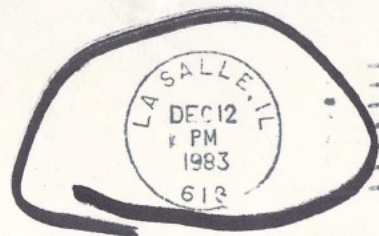
