Dear Lou,

After talking with you on the phone yesterday and finding that you were leaving for home from the hospital, I felt much better. However, as I cautioned you on the phone, please don't allow this wonderful development to color your situation to the point of losing touch with reality. With every passing day we are learning more about AIDS, some of it good and some of it bad, so keep up the research and stay on top of things. Keep a good, healthy mental attitude, but don't get either over pessimistic or over optimistic. And, for God's sake keep a low profile, as we discussed on the phone.

I guess this is as good a time as any to talk about my will, foundation etc. As you know, my mother died about 2 1/2 years ago and I had been putting off drawing a new will and giving the situation a good, long, hard think. You see, I have 2 older sisters and an older brother. I'm not going to go into the reasons, (in this letter, but someone will tell you personally) why I don't want one brother and one sister to get a single cent of my money. The other sister gets some, but she has children who can take care of her if necessary.

My will, on which I'm working now, is set up so that I make a few cash bequests to individuals and charities and dispose of my library and a few of my antiques outright. But this is a relatively small part of my estate. If the residue (the amount left after

my executor liquidates everything, pays expenses, and then does out the specific bequests is less than \$500,000, the ~~estate~~ <sup>residue</sup> is to be divided into percentages and closed out. (About 10 different people and charities will get the residue and you are mentioned.) However, if the residue is \$500,000 or more it will be enough to have a good foundation. I know \$500,000 sounds like a lot, but it really is not. If I were to die today, I estimate about \$200,000 residue and hopefully I'll live long enough and a few nice things will happen in the market etc, so that the foundation becomes a distinct possibility.

I envision the foundation to take effect instead of the percentages if there is \$500,000 in residue. The foundation will work as follows: The \$500,000 or more will be managed by professional money managers (probably Thomson McKim on my current employer). The 5 trustees will not be responsible for caring for or making the money, but only for spending it. Each year the money manager will tell the trustee the entire value of the fund as of Dec 31. The following year the trustee will be obligated to disburse 10% of the value of the fund.

I believe that the fund would waste away and be gone in 20-30 years, perhaps sooner, perhaps later depending on the success of the money managers. You see I'm not interested in a perpetual memorial to myself, but would like to see my life's work be tended for some period after my death.

I have chosen my 5 trustees with great

care. They are (1) You Tony, my closest  
hunchback friend (2) Larry Today, my oldest  
friend who lives in Pasadena (3) Jim Jones who  
was with GPO News and now lives in St. Louis, is  
currently asst professor at Washington U. (4)  
Cathy Galvin, good friend who is asst V.P.  
of brokerage firm in Denver and (5) Just, but  
not least, Lou Sullivan in S.F. Of course,  
I will be 6th ~~trustee~~ <sup>trustee</sup> of foundation is activated  
before I die and I assume all other ~~trustees~~  
trustees would follow my wishes at least until  
I die.

All trustees have several things in common.  
(a) all considerably younger than me. (b) all  
very bright in the head (c) all know me  
well and understand this complicated guy  
very well (d) all the most ethical, honest  
and reliable people I know. You will  
all love one another and be able to  
work together very well. Notice that  
the people all come from different walks  
of life, have their own set of friends, and  
ever live in different parts of the country. The  
differences are also important. For example,  
each trustee, upon becoming active will  
name his/her own successor. This little  
device is brilliant I think for it prevents the  
remaining trustees from grabbing control if one  
or two should die. Each trustee can select  
the person that he/she trusts to continue the  
work.

Trustees ~~will~~ will, as I see it, keep in  
touch by phone, mail etc. and share the  
working through of proposals for funding each  
year. They will be re-imbursed for out

of pocket expense and will be given small annual fee (based on amount they are giving away) for their efforts. Not enough to get rich on, but enough to be helpful in personal finance. Trustees might want to <sup>to propose</sup> meet once a year to give final approval. If so they decide where & when Call expense paid, so at very least a mini vacation could you for their efforts, plus some cash.

Don't worry about giving the money away. I'll leave a Video tape with general wishes, but trustees have final say in any case. I expect that once the word gets out that there is another foundation giving away money, the proposals will come in thick and fast, and the trustees will only have to cull out the best and turn down the obvious bad ones.

Of course I want money to go to Milwaukee and Wisconsin projects. Of course I want most to go to gay projects, but that doesn't rule out worthwhile straight projects. Of course money can go to other parts of country also. Of course I want little or better still none to go to religious groups or politicians, but even here an exception can be made etc.

I'll see that you get a copy of will when it is finished and I'll see that you get copies of Foundation when accomplished. I think all of this may take latter part of 1987 to get set up. Complicated as hell, but can be done with a good lawyer. Will is still in early stages, but has been thought through. All I need is a

bit of free time to finish up the rough draft  
to get to my attorney. I'm researching the  
foundation bit and it will follow. For  
now I'm working on the will. Wallace has  
spent an hour on it today, but have been  
too busy.

Be thinking about your successor and  
if your name Charles with his Eastern  
religion I'll pull your hair out. Say  
hello to him for me if you get this before  
he leaves.

Get to work on autobiography, author dear!
