"LIGHTNING TURNS WOMAN INTO MAN!"

The July 21, 1987 issue of Sun (a National Enquirer-type tabloid) reports that a 35-year-old woman from West Germany was struck by a lightning, causing "an almost instantaneous sex change." A FTM POPE?

A FTM reigned as Pope John VIII for 2 yr. 5 mos. 4 days, after Leo IV and before Benedict III. In 855 A.D., passing as a man, Joannes was elected pope by the people. John VIII was discovered when, nine months pregnant, he rode in a procession on a donkey and went into labor. He was murdered on the spot. A bust of Pope John VIII was placed with other popes in the Siena Cathedral in 1400 and later destroyed by Pius V.
