WHO IS NANCY CAIN? WHAT IS SHE DOING HERE?

THE IFGE BOARD OF DIRECTORS APPOINTED NANCY J. CAIN EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR ON JANUARY 22, 1999



he decision was facilitated by Ms. Cain's comprehensive knowledge of each department at IFGE, owing to her tenure as Director of Operations, a position she assumed in 1996 and continues to hold. The appointment is seen as a sign of the Board's confidence in the staff's collaborative approach to running the organization, which is facilitated by Ms. Cain's cooperative management style.

When asked what she saw as the direction of IFGE, Ms. Cain replied, "IFGE needs to provide education and information with compassion, to help ourselves by helping others, to make ourselves known to the mainstream and to bring us into the new millennium with dignity and grace. Only by working together as a community can we accomplish what we want, what we need, and what is necessary for all of us to realize our dreams".

"There are people doing significant and important work to create common terms by which transgender people may describe/represent themselves to their care providers and the world at large. I am not interested in arguing semantics when people's lives are at stake. Our efforts must meet people on their own ground, using the terms with which they self identify, appreciating the complexity of their individuality, and at the same time providing enough infor-

mation to those outside of our community so that we all may successfully interact. When we provide just one person with enough hope to find an alternative to depression, to substance abuse, or to suicide, we justify our continued mission -- for what price is there on a life?

"In society's eyes, we are considered "other" because we don't conform to gender "norms." However, we are no better than society if we treat ourselves and those in our community as "other." Only by working together and by going past the boundaries of our fears will we be able to make the whole greater than the sum of the parts. It will take a concerted effort by national and international Gay, Lesbian, Bisexual, and Trans organizations to accomplish this. To fulfil the spirit of our mission, IFGE must work with others in the entire spectrum of gender experience. Our work together is too important to let our separate egos interfere with obtaining universal equality, respect, and the recognition of each person's integrity.

"There are those who rely upon us, and there are also those upon whom we rely. Our relationship with the queer and straight communities must be mutual. We recognize and honor that interdependence. We view it as essential to equality. We understand that to

She is also familiar with the pain of being an outcast and the tortuous years of being closeted. Having no one to turn to, she suffered depression, abused alcohol, drugs, and herself. She has labored hard over the years to come to terms with these difficult issues.

Knowing the impact of a friendly voice, a reassuring tone from someone who understands, Nancy is committed to see that others will have IFGE to turn to in their time of need. $\quad \Delta$

Nearly all of our current print run (8,000) is being sold. Remaining stock for the Fall and Winter 1998 issues is so low that we need to consider larger future print runs to accomidate phone and internet requests for current issues.

Community feedback on the Winter 1998 issue is very possitive. Reaction has included: "possibly the best cover ever." Laurels were also given for continued "hard-hitting content."

Approximately I/3rd of the Fall 1998 issues is translated into Spanish, and is awaits posting on our web site. The translator is a member of the cross-dressing community, offers services at a competitive rate, and is eager to co-ordinate the release of future translations on the web site with the eng-

lish version's release on American newstands.

The focus for all 1999 issues of TransGender Tapestry is decided, and sent to contributers. Solicitations for articles on these themes from the general public were released to appropriate internet lists.

The Spring 1999 issue is on schedule. Expect to see your copy by mid-March.

O 200 copies of the Winter 1998 issue were returned to our distributer. Those venues who returned the issues are pornography vendors. They felt unable to place a cover with a child on their racks without risk of legal action. We see this as a positive indication that the magazine is indeed becoming more mainstream.

FINANCE COMMITTEE REPORT

Vivian Allen issued a challenge to the board to come up with \$10,000 by 31 January 1999. The board's total donation was \$10,575. Vivian will thus donate \$5000 and Julie Johnson decided to match the board and donated an additional \$10,000,

The "Adopt a Brochure" appeal to vendors, distributers, advertisers, and helping professionals made in late December has met limited success thus far.

IFGE recently enlisted Milliken & Michaels, a collection agency, to pursue some older accounts receivables. They have recouped about \$4000 to date.

he meeting was opened at 10:15am. Quorum was lost at 3:30pm and the meeting was adjourned at 3:58pm. Attending board members were: Yvonne Cook-Riley, Kristine James, Julie Johnson, Pamela Geddes, Linda Buten, Laura Caldwell, Abby Saypen, and Alison Laing.

Winnie brant resigned from the board, and Linda Buten will not seek reelection.

Kristine James reported the Lousiville convention group is very energetic, and most items are in place. Julie Johnson

motioned to allow a management company to look into the possibilities of a year 2000 convention and report back to the board in March. It was seconded by Abby Saypen and passed by verbal acclimation.

Laura Caldwell made a motion to appoint Nancy Cain as Executive Director. Julie Johnson seconded. The motion was passed unanimously.

The board had lunch brought in and ate during an hour long presentation by the IFGE CPA, Terri Creeden of Sanberg, Gonzalez,

and Creeden, P.C. She sugested to the board certain accounting changes and gave insight on general issues for non-profits like IFGF

Yvonne gave a report on the 11th annual Creating Change conference she attended in November. She also wanted to see IFGE back at the APA, so she outlined projected costs. She concluded by inducing a resolution to budget \$900-1000 for the APA convention to be held in Washington. Julie Johnson seconded. Results were 4 yes, 1 no, 2 abstain (including the chair).
