Dear Community Member,

As you know, The Audre Lorde Project's Working Group on Police Violence is dedicated to ending police brutality and violence. One of ALP's first projects, it is open to all Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, Two Spirit and Transgender (LGBTST) People of Color who are committed to seeking justice for victims of police violence and brutality. It is also interested in exploring new and creative ways to stop future injustices.

The Working Group on Police Violence seeks to develop analysis, to educate and to mobilize LGBTST people of color communities on issues of police violence. One of the most insidious effects of police violence is the silencing of both the victims of police brutality and of the marginalized communities they are part of. Their silence, although a legitimate response to the violence, makes it difficult to learn about the extent of the violence against our communities.

In an effort to document the experience of those subjected to this injustice, the Working Group on Police Violence has developed a police violence survey. This confidential survey seeks to better document in a limited way the experience of police brutality and violence in our communities. We ask that you take the time to fill it out and return it to the Working Group on Police Violence c/o The Audre Lorde Project (ALP). The results of this survey will help us develop a report on the extent of police brutality on LGBTST communities of color in New York City.

Please take the time to fill out the survey and return it to us by June 15th. Only through our collective effort, can we hope to end police violence and free our communities from the oppression of police brutality.
