SEX-OP GIRL FIGHTS FOR HER JOB

Julia is told to move

SEX-CHANGE girl Julia Grant—whose story was seen by millions of television viewers—was last night fighting to save her hospital job.

Her bosses want to switch her from £42-a-week catering manager to a lower-paid night cook's job at another hospital.

Julia—who was previously George Roberts—said: "I think they are just trying to get me out of the way."

The background to her sex-change was shown on BBC2's Inside Story documentary on Monday night.

She was seen packing up her men's clothes into a case and sending them to Oxfam.

Julia, 24, works at St Luke's in Woodside, North London—a hospital for the mentally sick.

Switch

She was told to switch to Middlesex Hospital four miles away after telling her employers she planned a sex-change operation.

Mr David Knowles, administrator for Kensington, Chelsea and Westminster Health Authority, said: "We thought she would be fully agreeable to the move, as the documentary would inevitably put extra pressure on an already difficult situation."

The Confederation of Health Service Employees said they would fight to ensure a fair deal for Julia, who lives in North London.
