WALK LIKE A WOMAN!


Learn poise, grace and confidence in your feminine self!

FROM KAYE . . .

A BETTER WAY

Our culture presents us with special challenges, most of which we as cross dressers invent out of necessity.

The purpose of my column is to share these discoveries and make life a bit easier, a lot more fun and perhaps even glamorous.

While I'll be relating my own discoveries, why not share your discoveries also for this column. Think your ideas through thoroughly, jot them down and send them to me: Kaye Fisher, PO Box 433, Corte Madera, CA 94925. I'll be sure you receive full credit for your contribution.

If you are a user of the new press-on type nails and are less than happy with the glue tabs which are included, here is a tip to stop the usual end of the day or evening nail wobble.

I have found that contact cement works beautifully. It's relatively fast, easy to apply and holds nails in place with strength and durability. I've gone three days with only minor adjustments.

There are many brands on the market but the best I've used is a cement made by Ross Chemical of Detroit, Michigan 48209. It's sold in the hardware glue section in K-Mart and other major drug and variety stores at about \$1.50 a tube, enough for 25 or more applications. It comes in a blister carded tube package usually on a peg. The tube allows ease of application and keeps the glue from drying out in the container.

You apply a coating of glue to the plastic nail and let it dry while you finish your makeup or dressing. When you're ready to "go" apply a coating of glue to your own nails and let it dry for 10 to 15 minutes. Then start to affix the nails to your own nails being careful to align the nail correctly. Bonding is instant and strong with no margin for adjustment. Press each nail with finger pressure for about 10 seconds, pressing out any tiny air bubbles. You can now manicure and shape the nails to your preferred length or shape. Keep them dry for at least 1½ hours if possible.

Here's the great part. When the nails are ready to be removed, apply even outward pressure on the tip and edges and the nail will separate from your own nail, taking all the glue with it. Now merely place the nails in a glass of cold water overnight. Then with the help of a pin simply remove the glue from the plastic nail in one clean action. Every bit of glue pulls off and your nails are like brand new to use over and over again.

Having most colors of Lee Press Ons, I keep them in a molded compartment plastic storage box, purchased in the fishing equipment section of most stores. I also prefer to apply the glue with a small disposable children's paint brush found in a dime store.


MEMBERSHIP RENEWALS NOW DUE



J2CP Information Services provides an information package consisting of pamphlets and literature concerning gender dysphoria syndrome, transsexualism and transvestism. This information package is available at a cost of \$25.00 to cover research, printing, postage and secretarial services. Additionally, J2CP Information Services will attempt to provide referrals to reputable counselors, psychotherapists, or gender programs, and peer groups near your home.
